Attendance



We encourage all children to have excellent attendance at E-ACT Blackley Academy

This year we have managed to raise our attendance above the national average. We would like to thank all our families for working hard to ensure children attend school every day.

Regular school attendance brings enormous benefits to individual pupils, their families, schools and the community as a whole. Without regular attendance, levels of attainment suffer and opportunities are missed to obtain maximum benefit from education.

Persistent absence and lateness will affect a child's achievement and progress in school. Comprehensive research shows that there is a direct link between a child's level of school attendance and their level of school attainment.

As a parent, it is your legal responsibility to ensure your child receives a suitable full-time education. It is your responsibility that your child attends school each day and is on time.

It is important to set the expectation of good attendance right from the beginning of school so children grow up with 'good habits'

What happens if we are worried about your child's school attendance?

Good attendance is 95% or more, if attendance is below 90% the child is classified as 'persistently absent' from school and this will have a negative impact on the child's learning.

If we have concerns about your child's attendance, we will contact you so that we can offer support and work together to make sure your child's attendance is good.

School Uniform

A polite reminder to all parents that children must be wearing full school uniform on the first day back after the summer break. The full list of our uniform is available on the school website.

Can I please remind parents that children must wear 'black school shoes'. You should also make sure that children are wearing the correct PE kit.
